The Jolys Regional Library reserves the right to interrupt or discontinue use of any terminal for any reason.

The Selection Policy which guides the Library's purchase of written materials cannot be applied to information accessed through the INTERNET. Similarly, the library assumes no responsibility for the quality or accuracy of information retrieved from the INTERNET. This is the responsibility of the user.

Children must get parent /guardian permission to use the INTERNET at the library. During school hours, students must get a teacher's written permission for the use of the INTERNET.

The library can accept no liability for the use of the INTERNET by children. Parents are responsible for their children's actions, as it is not possible for library staff to **totally** control material accessed by children and youth on the INTERNET.

Please enter your name on the log-in sheet provided. Half-hour time slots may be reserved. If no one is waiting when time is up, user may sign up for another time slot.

Staff assistance with computer use will be given whenever time and knowledge permit.

Misuse or abuse of computers and the INTERNET will result in suspension of privileges.

Persons using this equipment agree not to make any changes to the set-up or configuration of the software of hardware.

Files created on the public access computer will not be private and may be deleted by staff.

While chat lines may be informational, they tend to be oriented more toward entertainment than research. Therefore, users are requested to refrain from accessing Chat lines.

Users are advised to refrain from revealing their personal address or credit card information on the INTERNET.

Users will be asked to pay a printing charge per page.
